Friendship Group

On Tuesday 19th April a few of the fiddlers went along to entertain the Friendship Group in the hall. The group was augmented for the day by guests from outwith Strachur who were brought along courtesy of the Cowal Befrienders, so a good audience was guaranteed.

The usual suspects of Evie, Ishbel, Martin and John played a mixed set of tunes and John and Geraldine Chamberlain provided a couple of songs each to add to the mix. As a result of the performance we were asked if we would go along to play for the residents at Fountain Quay, so now the LFW can go on tour!

It is good to get the LFW out playing in public to let people see and hear what we can offer – maybe even gain some new recruits. Geraldine has now signed up for fiddle tuition and her singing is an additional element in our future concert parties.

Highlands and Islands Music and Dance Festival

I was fortunate enough to be invited once again to comper the fiddle competitions in the Regent Hotel in Oban at this year's festival (the 33rd year of this major event) which took place from 29th April till 1st May.

Competitors range from the very young (under 12), through the 12 -16 group to the adult competitors who contest 2 major classes – March, Strathspey and Reel, and Slow Air (Traditional). The standard is always of the very highest and all competitors offered a very varied selection of tunes in their sets, ranging from West Coast pipe marches to the great tunes of Skinner, Marshall and Gow. The junior players came from as far afield as Islay, Dingwall, Edinburgh, Campbeltown and other distant places, though once again there was a noted absence of anyone from either of the Cowal workshops. Where are our young players hiding out?

The six adult players who contested the Open competitions came from Tarves, Tarland, East Kilbride, Edinburgh and the USA! Five of the six were Glenfiddich invitees and two were previous winners! Their playing was "chust sublime". Judge for the day was top Scottish Traditional fiddler Paul Anderson from Tarland and his adjudication and advice were so valuable as he spoke of the importance of accurate tuning and intonation, good bowing, and timing. He stressed that when we attempt pipe marches we really should be listening to top pipers playing the tunes. Tempo is very important in playing those tunes and we must resist the temptation to play them too fast! Not a problem for me, anyway!

I thoroughly recommend that you put next year's event in your diaries, including The Masters on the Friday evening in St John's Church, where invited players compete in fiddle and accordion competitions. This is a great musical feast.
