TRAVEL

By road from Glasgow:

Strachur lies on the eastern shore of Loch Fyne, approximately 60 miles from Glasgow. Follow the A82 Loch Lomond road until you join the A83, sign-posted Campbeltown, at Tarbet. Go through Arrochar and over the 'Rest and Be Thankful' pass, turn left on to the A815 Dunoon road. Go through St Catherine's. At Strachur, pass the Creggans Inn, stay on the A815 for approximately $\frac{3}{4}$ mile, passing the Petrol Station on your left. As you pass the end of the village take the road on your right, sign-posted Glenbranter. Strachur Primary School is 500 yards on your left.

By Gourock – Dunoon ferry:

From Glasgow, follow the M8 to Greenock. Continue to Western Ferries at McInroy's Point in Gourock. Ferries run every 20 minutes. On disembarking, turn right and follow the loch-side to a T-junction. Turn right onto the A815, sign posted Strachur, and continue for about 16 miles. Enter Strachur, 40 MPH sign, and take the first road on your left, sign-posted Glenbranter. Strachur Primary School is 500 yards on your left.

Programme

13.00pm – 15.15pm	Traditional Fiddle Workshop
15.30pm – 17.00pm	Country Walks (weather permitting), or fiddle play in Strachur Memorial Hall, children must be accompanied and supervised by a responsible adult.

Apart from the actual workshop, children must be accompanied and supervised by a responsible adult.

Strachur Memorial Hall has an enclosed all weather court for children to play in.

Walks.

The Mast, Strachur.

Approximately 40 minutes to the mast. This is a fairly steady, uphill walk with a couple of mildly strenuous parts. There is a well-defined road which takes you past a ruined water mill and an Iron Age fort. Further up, you cross a ford, dry shod. Enjoy a kiss at the Kissing Gate. At the summit you are rewarded with spectacular views of Loch Fyne, Ben Cruachan and the Paps of Jura.

Sensible footwear, sun screen, insect repellent (this is Argyll) and a drink of water are advisable. Bring your camera.

The Shore, Strachur.

Follow the A815 back down to the shore. This is an easy walk along a pavement. Continue along the A815 or turn left onto the A886 and enjoy views of Loch Fyne, with a chance to see porpoises. Bay Cottage tea room or the famous Creggans Inn are open for refreshments. Bring your camera.

Strachur Estate.

Take the beech avenue to the Old Inn and go through the field gate before the church. A leisurely walk through the estate of author Sir Charles MacLean, it takes about 30 minutes. Rhododendrons are in bloom and trees and shrubs in leaf. Exit onto the main A815 and enjoy spectacular views down Loch Fyne. Sensible shoes, sun screen and insect repellent are recommended. Remember your camera.

BBQ Children attending the workshop will be entitled to a free burger and bun at 5pm along with a soft drink. The BBQ is at **Strachur Memorial Hall**. Vegetarian option will be available. Children must be accompanied and supervised by a responsible adult who are welcome to purchase burgers and drinks for themselves.

Recital and Family Ceilidh It is hoped that all those attending the workshop will be able to take part in the evening recital. The tutors will also take part.

Tea and cakes will be available for a small charge and then we will take to the floor for traditional Scottish dancing.
